
Augusta County Library Banned Books Week 2016

To celebrate Banned Books Week, the library commissioned an art installation. Local artist Ben Thomas created this mixed media piece by deconstructing and burning banned or challenged books that had been donated to the library, but were in poor condition.

Adult Display - included graphics and posters provided by ALA




The public could check out the display books or use them to take a Banned Book Mug Shot. Staff created the mug shot station on a bulletin board adjacent to the adult book display




.A poster at the top of the mug shot bulletin board encouraged patrons to take a mug shot and to share their photos on Instagram with the hash tag #readACL.




A mug shot card was also provided, reading "Caught Reading Banned Books, 9/2016, Augusta County Library). Here are some of the mug shots:
