THE ASSIGNMENT

ENG 111 students:

- Identify a topic or issue the community should be aware of.
- Write an argument essay establishing why the topic is important for the campus community to know about.
- Propose books/library resources for a library display on the topic.

Librarians review the proposals and select up to three students from each class to make their display a reality in the library.

THIS PROJECT WHY WE


- Fosters a sense of community and builds relationships among students, faculty, and staff
- Recognizes, values, and builds on students' experiences and interests
- Enhances student engagement, which we see during the library session and in their essays
- Provides students with a platform for sharing their ideas and raising awareness about issues they care about
- Helps students to think about how to present a topic visually
- Provides fresh ideas for collection development


