7 Reasons you need a Puzzlepalooza:

- 1.Educational
- 2.Expands the concept of puzzles
- 3.Introduction to new types of puzzles
- 4.Grow new puzzle-solvers

5.A peaceful Convention

- 6.Appeals to multiple generations
- 7.Low cost, high interest

Step 1: Planning

Gather a committee of puzzle enthusiasts.

- staffing is essential
 since some attendees
 were unfamiliar with
 certain puzzles.
- if enthusiasts aren'texperienced, providetraining for staff.
- Select a location, date, and time.

Select a target audience.

- what ages?
- what community?Organize a schedule .
- include any activities
 that are not on-going
 such as Escape Rooms,
 Jigsaw Puzzle Contests
 or crafts.
- schedule lunches for
 staff (and make sure the
 person filling in
 understands how the
 puzzles work.)

Step 2: Focus

Select which categories of puzzles to highlight.

7 Categories of Puzzles:

- 1. Word
- 2. Cryptic
- 3. Mechanical
- 4. Logic
- 5. Math
- 7. Riddles

6. Trivia

Step 3: Evaluate your puzzle collection

Make sure all jigsaw puzzle pieces are there.
Make sure you have puzzles for target ages.
Make sure you have at least one puzzle of each

type.

Step 4: Build up your puzzle collection

Create your own crosswords, Sudoku and cryptogram puzzles to avoid copyright violations.

- Develop puzzles far in advance.
- Recruit multiple proofreaders.

Create mechanical puzzles using a 3D printer.

Use online puzzle generators. (QR code link to sites).

Use your budget to buy more puzzles.

Accept donated puzzles. (have staff verify donated puzzles are complete.)

Step 5: Communication& Floorplan

Keep your committee updated. Meet as needed.

Tell the world about your event.

Map out a track for customers to engage in puzzles.

- Some puzzles can be set up in stations in the middle of the library.
- Some activities need individual rooms.

Consider grouping puzzle stations together so staff can assist with different puzzle types.

Step 6: Host your event!

Invite patrons to participate. Be prepared to explain what Puzzlepalooza is all about.

Gather feedback during your event. Collect stats. (We used clickers at each station.)

Step 7: Wrap up

Review feedback and statistics.

Survey committee for improvement.

Plan your next Puzzlepalooza.
